Minutes of the Board of Directors

April 3rd 2007

On April 3rd 2007, President Rick Nowak called a meeting of the Board of Directors, at the Broadway Diner, at 6:00 P M. Present were Ray Cisneros (Board member), Sue Cisneros (Treasurer), Wayne Fleming (Secretary), Ginny Hester (Member), Roy Hester (Past President), Spud Hester (Board Member), Bob Hoffman (Member), Sandy Hoffman (Board Member), Don Lacy (Board Member), and Rick Nowak (President).

Rick reported that he received a call from Robert Snowden of ACE/CCI about our club leaving their organization. Robert Snowden stated that the roster requirement, which we had objected to, was not a requirement for Charter membership. The roster requested was for ACE marketing only and had nothing to do with J.C. Taylor Classic Car Insurance requirement. This is in contradiction to the charter form sent to the Club and information presented by Joe Whitaker (CCI) and Jack Scott (ACE/CCI) representative. The Board decided to let the vote stand as was accepted in the January 2007 General meeting.

Judging at Chevy Showdown will not be done by participants this year. A group of approx. 10 members will judge instead, to eliminate the problems with ballot counting.

Concern was expressed that changes must take place to expedite the show registration due to the ever continuing growth of the Show. Ballot counting due to the large number of participation is extending too far into the afternoon. It was discussed and determined that at the 2007 Show we try judging by a Club appointed committee of approximately 10 in lieu of Pier Judging. Rick commented that if a change in procedure does not occur or more participation by club members occur on the day of show, that there is a potential the show may not be able to continue.

It was decided to discontinue the "standard" Sand Painting for Club Choice and replace with a larger plaque similar to the Award Plaques.

It was decided to discontinue selling the "length of car" raffle tickets due to the overwhelming effect on the small tumbler cage. The consensus was to sell multiple tickets at finger tip to finger tip.

The By Law changes, passed by the membership in January, were ratified by the Board of Directors and will be included in the annual Package to the State Corporation Commission with the annual financial statement.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this organization shall be The Classic Chevy Club of Tucson, Inc., a non-profit corporation in the State of Arizona, USA.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be to establish an association of members for the purpose of encouraging restoration and/or preservation of all 1955 through 1972 Chevrolet vehicles.

ARTICLE III AFFILIATION

None.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERS

Section 1: Eligibility

Membership shall be open to persons with a genuine interest in the 1955-1972 Chevrolet vehicles. Ownership of a Classic is not a requirement of membership.

Section 2: Enrollment

Enrollment shall require an annual membership fee as set by the members. The family of each member shall fall under his/her membership. Dependant children may remain under the family membership until the age 21.

Section 3: Prospective Members

Prospective members may attend meetings and outings as a guest of the club. Member privileges are not extended to guests.

Section 4: Types of Memberships

Regular Memberships

Those individuals possessing regular membership shall enjoy all rights and privileges of the club.

Voted and Passed By Unanimous Vote at Jan. 16, 2007 General Meeting. Thus adopted by Club Vote.

Associate Membership

Associate membership shall be available for those individuals/families living in excess of seventy five miles of Tucson. Annual dues shall be 60% of the full dues established by the membership.

Section 5: Voting Rights

A: Member and Spouse

The member and spouse shall have one vote each on matters submitted to the vote of the membership. Voting rights extend to members and spouses only and do not include children of members. Children may have their own separate membership by joining the club on their own.

B: Officer and Board of Directors Meetings

While the meetings are open to the General Membership, voting privileges at Board meetings are limited to the four elected Board of Directors, Past President, President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. The remaining Officers (Sergeant-at-Arms, Public Relations Representative, Webmaster, Librarian/Historian and Newsletter Editor) may provide input and recommendations to the voting Officers but have no vote.

C: Associate Members

No Voting Privileges to this membership.

Section 6: Expulsion

The Board of Directors will carefully review each case and then present their findings to the general Membership. A membership may be terminated for failure to pay dues when due. Infractions of club rules or by-laws and/or other actions may also be cause for expulsion or disciplinary measures. Incidents in question shall be brought to the attention of the voting membership and measures to be taken shall be decided by vote, after which the member(s) under action shall be given written notice, at his/her last known address, or his/her right to submit his/her position to the voting membership.

Section 7: Resignation

Any member may resign his/her membership by filing a written resignation with the secretary. Such resignation shall be effective upon receipt of such notice and upon payment of any and all indebtedness to the club. Dues shall be forfeited.

Section 8: Transfer of Membership

Membership in the Classic Chevy Club of Tucson is not transferable.

ARTICLE V MEETINGS of MEMBERS

Section 1: Annual and Special Meetings

A: Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the members shall be in the month of July of each year for the purpose of installing club officers and directors to serve in the upcoming year and for the transaction of such business as may come before the meeting.

B: Special Meetings

Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the President, Board of Directors or at the request of five (5) or more general members.

C: Place of Meetings

The President or Board of Directors may designate the place of Annual or Special meetings.

D: Notice of Meetings

Written notice stating place, date, and time of Annual or Special meetings shall be delivered to each member entitled to vote at such meeting, not less than five (5) days before the meeting. In the case of special meetings, the purpose of the meeting shall be considered to be delivered when deposited in the mail, addressed to the member, at his/her last known address.

Section 2: Monthly Meetings

Monthly meetings of members shall be at a time and place determined by the membership.

Section 3: Quorum

A quorum shall be the number of members present at the scheduled meeting. A majority shall be 51% of those present.

Section 4: Proxies

A member entitled to vote but unable to attend a meeting, may do so by proxy, executed in writing by the member or direct contact to the President.

Section 5: Manner of Acting

A majority of votes entitled to be cast on a matter to be voted upon by the members present or represented by proxy at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be necessary for the adoption thereof.

Voted and Passed By Unanimous Vote at Jan. 16, 2007 General Meeting. Thus adopted by Club Vote.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS, BOARD of DIRECTORS

Section 1: Election, Number and Tenure

The officers of the Classic Chevy Club of Tucson shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant at Arms, Public Relations Representative, Librarian/Historian, Webmaster and Newsletter Editor. The officers shall be elected by the club's regular members at the June meeting. The Board of Directors will be the outgoing Club President and the remaining four (4) shall be elected by the club's regular members at the annual meeting. Tenure for all positions shall be June through July. Board of Directors will serve two year terms and two positions will be open each year.

Section 2: Removal

Any officer or member of the Board of Directors, elected by the membership of the club, may be removed by a majority vote of the membership whenever, in their judgment, the best interest of the organization would be served by such action. Such removal shall be carried out only after the officer/board member has been notified of the intended action and has been given an opportunity to submit his/her position to the membership.

Section 3: Vacancies

Vacancies of any office, for any reason, shall be filled by membership vote, such special election being applicable to the unexpired portion of the term of the office concerned.

Section 4: Duties and Responsibilities

A: Board of Directors

Members of the Board of Directors shall represent the Corporation in all club activities and meetings. The Board of Directors is responsible for long range planning of club activities that will be passed to the President for implementation and execution. The Board shall provide guidelines to the Officers. The Board will also review the bank records annually and perform all other duties specified within the By-Laws.

B: President

The President shall be the principal officer of the organization and shall, in general, supervise and control all the business and affairs of the organization. He/She will preside at all meetings of the members and Board of directors. The President shall carry out the directives of the Board of Directors.

C: Vice President

In the absence of the President, or in the inability of the President to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have the power of the President. In addition, the Vice

President shall head all committees and report their progress to the President. The Vice President shall perform other duties as assigned by the President.

D: Secretary

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of members and Board of Directors, see that notices are given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws, and in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other matters as assigned by the President.

E: Treasurer

The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of, and responsibility for, all funds of the organization, receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable, deposit all such monies in the name of the organization in such depositories as may be designated for that purpose, and in general, perform all duties incident to the office and such other duties as assigned by the President. The Treasurer is authorized to dispense funds for club expenses up to but not exceeding \$ 250.00. Expenditures greater than \$ 250.00 must be approved by no less than one officer and one member of the Board of Directors. Pre-Approved expenditures for routine operating costs do not require pre-approval. The Treasurer will be the custodian of Corporation Records.

F: Sergeant at Arms

The Sergeant at Arms shall be responsible for ensuring that order is maintained during all club functions and that the club rules are adhered to, and shall perform such other duties assigned by the President.

G: Public Relations Representative

The Public Relations Representative shall act as the club representative in contacting organizations or individuals outside the club on the club's behalf, help coordinate club activities, and perform such other duties as assigned by the President.

H: Librarian/Historian

The Librarian/Historian shall keep club historical records, i.e., file copies of newsletters, both from the club and to the club, maintain club photo albums and other such records, maintain file copies of publications such as national magazines and technical publications as they become available, and perform such other duties as assigned by the President.

I: Newsletter Editor

The Newsletter Editor shall publish the monthly newsletter to be delivered to all members, and any other mass published items necessary for the membership, keep records of individual participation, keep a record of each member's mailing address and perform such other duties as assigned by the President.

J: Webmaster

Maintain the club electronic website as directed by the President.

ARTICLE VII COMMITTEES

Section 1: Activities Committee

The activities committee shall be a committee made up of volunteers from the membership. They shall make club members aware of club activities, poll members, and perform such other duties as assigned by the President.

Section 2: Other Committees

Other committees shall be appointed by the Officers/Board of Directors for specific purposes as deemed necessary.

ARTICLE VIII CLUB AWARDS

Section 1: Special Awards

Special awards may be presented when deemed appropriate by the membership of the club.

Section 2: Club Participation Award

The Club Participation Award shall be presented at the annual meeting of the membership in July of each year. This will be a single award presented to the individual/family membership that has earned the greatest number of points by attending meetings and other activities during the previous year.

Section 3: Eligibility

In order to be eligible for the receipt of any club award, the member must have current membership in the local club.

ARTICLE IX CLUB RULES

Section 1: Purpose

The following club rules are designed to help reduce fuel costs for members and avoid damage to classics, while promoting a positive attitude toward the club by the general public.

Section 2: Caravans on Interstate Highways

Voted and Passed By Unanimous Vote at Jan. 16, 2007 General Meeting. Thus adopted by Club Vote.

When the club, as a group, is caravanning on an interstate highway, the group shall heed the posted speed limit, stay in the "slow lane" except when passing other slower vehicles, drive in a manner so as not to obstruct other vehicles, and show courtesy to other drivers.

Section 3: Caravans in Town

When the club, as a group, is caravanning in town, the group shall travel in single file, maintain a safe distance between classics, and observe posted speed limits.

Section 4: Alcoholic Beverages

It is the responsibility of each club member to limit his/her consumption of alcohol at club functions so as not to endanger his/her selves or others or to bring discredit upon the club.

ARTICLE X FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on the first day of January of each year.

ARTICLE XI DUES

Section 1: Amounts

The amount of initiation fees, if any, and annual dues payable to the Corporation, shall be set by the general membership.

Section 2: Payment of Dues

Local dues shall be payable as of the monthly meeting held in the month of January of each year. Dues not paid by February 28 shall be deemed *delinquent* and *member(s)* shall be removed from the March membership roster. Annual dues of new members shall be an amount established by a club vote and 60 % for those joining in the second half of the year.

ARTICLE XII AMENDMENTS to BYLAWS

These bylaws may be altered, amended, or repealed and new bylaws may be adopted by a majority of the membership present (minimum of 2/3 quorum) at any regular meeting or at any special meeting, if at least five (5) days written notice is given of intention to alter, repeal or adopt new bylaws at such meeting.
