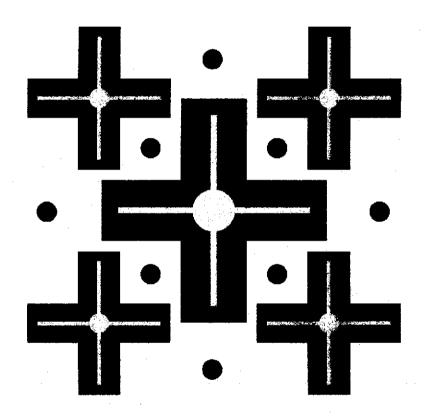

President asked for comments or questions on this year's Annual Report and thanked those who worked on the Report.

Recognition of 2012 Annual Report for Year End Review......President Lisa Fannin

Financial Report/Treasurer's Report/Audit Report......Treasurer Ellen Knobel

Financial summary: cash balances up from last year and finished 2012 with surplus – unexpected in light of approval of deficit budget at last year's annual meeting. General fund income exceeded budget and expenses were under budget. Funds were applied to replacing the lighting to take advantage of SRP incentives. Mortgage was refinanced and interest rate lowered for savings of over \$3,000 annually. Funded a music director position.

2013 Budget/Mission Plan......Treasurer Ellen Knobel

Kim Meighan moved to accept the 2013 Budget as proposed. Beth Rhue seconded the motion and the 2013 Budget was accepted unanimously by the congregation. The 2013 Budget was passed as presented.

Dave Alexander spoke regarding the Financial Report and the 2013 Budget. He cautioned that, although we are doing well, we still need to be diligent regarding church finances.

Pastor Brent spoke regarding the Financial Report and the 2013 Budget, and thanked Treasurer Ellen Knobel for doing such a stellar job as our Treasurer. Pastor Brent also announced that Ellen is willing to fulfill the position for another year.

Other Business

Pastor Brent explained the significance of the Synod and Churchwide Benevolence Disbursements. Pastor Les Hoffmann thanked Pastor Brent for speaking regarding the Benevolence Disbursement and asked whether the Synod MLA (Missional Leadership Academy) was helpful. Pastor Brent indicated that our Mission Statement and Guiding Principles were used as a model by other congregations, but have not had a full impact on our own congregation yet. It still needs to be fully utilized by Council and Ministry Teams in their decision making.

Pastor Brent also spoke regarding the election of Synod Assembly delegates. The Synod Assembly will be in Mesa this year from June 14-15, 2013. We will send one female and one male representative of the congregation to vote. Anyone may attend the Assembly, but only the elected delegates will vote. Lou Gebhard spoke regarding her attendance as a delegate last year in Henderson, Nevada. Fran Gorman volunteered to attend this year as the female delegate, but no male delegate volunteered. Pastor Brent advised that we will schedule a future congregational "Q and A" session to elect a male delegate for the Synod Assembly.

Sid Pettigrew moved that the Council look into the possibility of the Annual Congregational Meeting being moved to a Sunday that does not conflict with either the Super Bowl or the Phoenix Open. Lou Gebhard pointed out that the date of the Congregational Meeting is dictated by the church By-Laws, and changing the date would therefore involve an amendment. Kent Poppe pointed out that the National Football League is contemplating moving the date of the Super Bowl. Bob Fannin seconded the motion. A vote was called and the congregation unanimously approved the motion to address this issue.

President Lisa Fannin asked if there were any further questions, comments or matters to be addressed. There were none. This concludes the formal business of the annual meeting of the congregation.

We have examined the Balance Sheet of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church for the year ended December 31, 2013 and the related statements of Income, Expenses and Dedicated Accounts, all as included in the Gloria Dei Annual Report for 2013. In addition, we reviewed on a test basis, transactions and related documentation that support the income, expenses, cash flows and Dedicated Accounts included within the financial statements.

As a result of our examination, we believe that the financial statements referred to above fairly represent, in all material respects, the financial position of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church as of December 31, 2013 and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended.

During the course of our review, we found the condition of the financial records and supporting documentation to be good. From our sampling of the records and transactions, we believe that good internal control procedures are being followed and that proper approved documentation is available for financial transactions.

The Gloria Dei financial statements in this Annual Report include several footnotes, which should be read in conjunction with such statements.

Footnotes to 2013 Financial Statements

- 1. General Fund Income of \$318,329 was \$4,329 higher than budgeted because Current Envelope Giving was \$7,319 over budget, which was partially offset by a \$2,990 underage in other income categories. Total General Fund Expenses of \$336,072 were over budget solely because of an unanticipated need for repairs to the roof over Reiman Hall and adjacent areas. The result was a deficit of \$17,743 before the application of Dedicated Account funds. Because of the generosity of Gloria Dei members, \$14,252 of the Dedicated Account Reserve for Roof Repairs was applied to fully cancel out the cost of these repairs, reducing the deficit to \$3,491.
- 2. The budget approved by the congregation in February 2013 provided for the application of up to \$21,970 of Dedicated Accounts to be applied against General Fund Expenses. None of this amount was applied in 2013 and will be carried over to 2014.
- 3. The Lutheran Community Fund (LCF) invested in a total of three Vanguard Group mutual funds grew to \$164,151 at year end including dividends, capital gains and market appreciation. This total represents an increase of 18.1% compared to values at December 31, 2012. Dividends and capital gains of \$3,515 were received and reinvested in the funds during 2013.
- 4. In addition to budgeted operating expenses, many Gloria Dei members and friends support specific projects by making contributions to Dedicated Accounts. Examples of such support in 2013 are: Reserve for Roof Repairs \$18,140; Thanksgiving Baskets \$3,895; Mission Trip \$2,655 (including payments by participants); Scholarships \$2,139: Choice Dollars by Thrivent \$1,064; Lutheran World Hunger \$535; Souper Bowl \$511; Lutheran World Relief \$355; Paraments \$300.

"Renewing the Church"



Here's the hard truth. If you're a layperson in a congregation that's experiencing decline, whether the congregation thrives is ultimately up to you and the other members. Your Pastor can teach, guide, lead, support, inspire, even cajole. But in the end, congregational health is a function of how people in the congregation relate to one another, to God, and to their community... [So] when we talk about congregational renewal, we mean a renewal of the people's ability to notice and experience God in their midst, a renewal of the congregation's desire to partner with God in achieving God's aims for the world.

- Daniel P. Smith and Mary K. Sellon (Pathways to Renewal)

The above quote comes from a book that our Congregational Council has been reading through together over the past several months. It reinforces what the Church has always known, but too often forgets. That the core foundation of what it means to be the Church, is to be in God-centered, Christ-like relationships with one another and with the world. As the "golden age" of congregationalism continues to fade, we must reignite the passion to love and support our family and friends, our neighbors, those who are strangers to us, and even our enemies in the same way that Jesus did. It is in focusing on, and in many cases renewing, these Christ-like relationships, that the Church (both locally and globally) will find itself rejuvenated and relevant again.

So the focus for congregations in decline, it would seem, would be not to spend all of their energy and their resources on finding out which programs, or styles of worship, or even which innovative evangelism techniques are trending the best. Instead, faith communities who are truly interested in renewing what it means for them to be "the Church", must turn their attention back to the relationships they have with one another and with God.

If we are to truly be the Church, if we are to be the "Body of Christ", then our interactions with one another, with the world, and with God cannot simply be relationships of convenience. They must model the example of Christ. We, as followers of Christ, must be not in convenient, but covenant relationships. Relationships in which we earnestly desire to know God and God's vision for the world and in which we fervently strive to reflect that vision in all that we say and do.

As I look back over the past year, 2013 has provided us with this same challenge. As we continue to decline in membership and in average worship attendance, I am finding that, as a smaller church, our ministry needs are providing new opportunities for people to learn and serve together. From Bible Studies, to Altar Guild, to Choir, to Social Ministries, to our Second Saturday Education Program, members are beginning to re-engage with one another in new ways that are deepening their relationships with one another and with God. This cannot help but bring a new vitality to Gloria Dei. And although it may mean new ways of "doing Sunday School" or of providing "Music Ministry" for the community, I am certain that as long as we stay focused on our relationship with God (through intentional study and meaningful worship) and our relationship with each other (through prayer, service, and loving support), then Gloria Dei will continue to be a place where God's grace is seen as well as shared.

I look forward to the coming year and the challenges that still lie ahead. I am excited to begin work on the campus improvements that have been slated to begin this Spring and (hopefully) completed in the Fall. A new Youth Room dedicated in the memory of Jack Rose will begin to take shape this Spring / Summer. The new "Rose Room" will allow our Youth to have a space on campus where they can meet, laugh, play, share, and grow together in their covenant relationships. We are thankful to all those who have (and will) donate resources and time to create this much needed sacred space. I also look forward to a new "Cross" atop our Church and a new "Church Sign" along Stanford, both lovingly dedicated to the memories of Bob Meighan and Bob Walz. They will stand as beautiful reminders and invitations to those who pass by that Gloria Dei has been and continues to be a place where the real presence of God's grace makes a difference in the lives of the people here.

As always, I am blessed and thankful to be in relationship with all of you in this ministry we share!

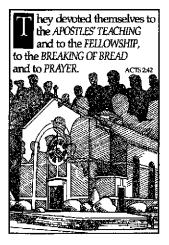

We thank Kristin Maxwell for her service as our volunteer Bookkeeper and continuing to assist with Second Saturday School.

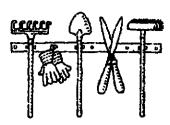

Facilities Report 2013

Each year we make some progress improving our physical plant, as well as repairing and "holding together" an aging facility. We had some of both this year.

- We were able to run electrical wiring in the Sanctuary to create a master control switch to be able to safely turn off all A/V equipment during the week. A protocol was put in place to sequence this process so programming will not be erased. This will bring us considerable electrical savings in the long run. With the change-out of the lighting in the Sanctuary and the other buildings, we were able to realize an electrical savings of over \$1300 this past year.
- We repaired a major leak in the valve box for the sprinkler system on the east side of the property.
- We reconfigured the circuit wiring for the pump to the columbarium fountain.
- A new security light was installed on the north-west corner of the administration building when the pole light was removed.
- Our biggest repair this year involved the replacement of the roof on Reiman Hall. After the severe rain storms we had this summer it was discovered the old foam roof had failed and was retaining excessive amounts of water <u>under</u> the foam. We were able to replace the roof with a new foam system which required removing all previous roofing material and replacing areas that had rotted due to the prolonged exposure to moisture. The congregation graciously donated funds to cover the cost of the roofing.
- We have retro-fitted exterior security lights with new LED bulbs for energy efficiency.
- We were able to have the eastside trees trimmed to prevent damage from storms this year.

I have attended 3 meetings this past year with the town of Paradise Valley to prepare the church for the road improvements on Stanford that will take place in 2014.

I am grateful to Ted Blackwelder, Forrest Hill, Ken Poppe, Jon Hilsabeck, and Wally Musegades for their assistance and support.

Future projects will be remodeling the Youth Room.

REPORT FOR 2013

"God's work. Our hands."

The Ministry for Spiritual Formation Team met throughout the year to discuss ongoing projects and new opportunities, and funding from the Social Ministry budget and congregational support. Team members are Lisa Fannin, Marilyn Mueller, Kent Poppe and Lynne Zoller. We are also appreciative of input provided by Marge O'Bert, Dave O'Bert, Carol Shaw, Gini Pettigrew, Jan Newman and Koni Anderson.

Our "small but mighty" congregation continues to be very generous! We provided year-around support to the Mt. of Olives Food Closet and Thrift Store, and Justa Center, through donations of food, water, toiletries, accessories and monetary contributions, which are delivered regularly throughout the year. Both of these ministries provide for many people in dire need, from food and clothing, to assistance with jobs and housing. The congregation's support really makes a difference.

Speaking of small but mighty, Second Saturdays, Gloria Dei's version of Sunday School, has really taken off. The children come to Reiman Hall the second Saturday of each month throughout the school year for education and activities with Pastor Brent. Lou Gebhard, Kristin Maxwell, Gaby Maxwell, Matt and Melissa Lien, John and Karie Bethell, and Koni Anderson, among others, also assist.

The Sew & Sews are making dresses out of pillow cases this year. They are just beautiful and relatively quick to make. Girls in many African nations are required to wear dresses in order to attend school. Many of these children are prevented from attending school simply because they do not own a dress. The Sew & Sews are sending girls to school in style in Africa this year!

Members of the Prayer Shawl Ministry prayerfully knit shawls for members of the congregation and others facing health issues and personal hardships. The shawls are then prayed over by the ministry team members before they are delivered. This loving ministry is much appreciated by the recipients of these beautiful handmade shawls.

Marge O'Bert heads up a care card ministry for Gloria Dei, which delivers and distributes handmade greeting or "comfort" cards to people in ER, trauma and ICU waiting rooms, hospital and care center chapels, workers and volunteers in hospitals, people in after-care and nursing homes, and the families of all of these. Marge incorporates beautiful original photographs, scripture and a related message in each of the cards, and information about Gloria Dei on the back.

Rhonda Alexander shares the gift of relaxation and rejuvenation of our bodies and minds as a certified yoga instructor. Yoga classes are held regularly in Reiman Hall, or alternatively in the Narthex. All levels are welcome to basic flow and relaxation/restorative pose classes designed for participation by anyone. Jinine Martin assists Rhonda, teaching alternate classes. There is no charge to participants, but a free will offering is accepted. Proceeds benefit various charities, including Mt. of Olives Food Closet, Compassion International and disaster relief. Mats and props are all provided so all you need bring is your smiling face! ©

We made a \$200 donation to Interfaith Cooperative Ministries in response to a letter asking Gloria Dei to purchase tickets to the organization's annual fundraiser.

We discontinued our Victory House ministry this year in August after coordinator Dave O'Bert was informed that we would be required to provide food for 150 people at each meal (as opposed to 70). Dave is open to resuming this worthwhile ministry, perhaps in cooperation with another small congregation. We did continue financial support of \$100 per month to them for the last 4 months of the year.

Sid and Gini Pettigrew headed up the Thanksgiving Basket ministry again this year. Our amazing congregation not only met the 100 basket goal, but exceeded it by 7 baskets. Kristin Maxwell organized the participation of many of her colleagues at Safeway again, and also arranged for a discounted price on the turkeys to go in the baskets. The effort was so successful this year that we were able to donate food supplies to Mt. of Olives in addition to the Thanksgiving Baskets delivered to 5 locations.

Lisa Fannin arranged for Gloria Dei to participate in the Salvation Army bell-ringing campaign again this year on December 7, 2013. Bob and Lisa and other members of the congregation rang bells and raised \$478.51 for the Salvation Army!

Soni Koskela organized the arts and crafts activities at the Arizona Burn Foundation Camp Courage Christmas Party again this year. Camp Courage is held every year in June to promote rehabilitation, confidence and self-esteem among young burn survivors. The annual Christmas Party is an opportunity for these kids to come together again with their entire families and celebrate. It was a great success again this year.

Jan Newman led our Angel Tree project again this year for Sunshine Acres Children's Home. We provided many specific items as well as gift cards for this non-denominational Christian village, which provides a faith-based home for children who would not otherwise have the opportunity to live in a family setting.

Thank you to all of the generous members of Gloria Dei for your time, energy, financial support and the passion that makes Gloria Dei such a wonderful place to worship, and provides the resources to reach beyond our church to the community and world around us.

The Worship and Music Team met regularly to support Pastor Brent and Leo in planning and implementing music in worship services.

Abby Anderson, Bobbie Kuni, Karie Bethell, Melissa Lien, and Chuck Knobel continue to serve as regular volunteer musicians/singers. Leo Lai is the Music Director; Randy McGlade is the Pianist/Organist.

The choir, with 16 dedicated singers, continues to meet in weekly rehearsals and present anthems in worship services; this year, members of the choir presented several anthems in the 7 p.m. and 11 p.m. Christmas Eve services.
